### Fireworks Night Goes with a Bang

It's really rewarding when we run events that are well supported and enjoyed by the community. This year's fireworks display was one of our most successful. We had terrific weather for the event which brought out the crowds. We are so fortunate in our community to have so many willing hands whose volunteer effort spreads the load so well. It can be daunting when you look at the marquees, tables, stock and litter after a busy day of preparing for the event and an evening serving the community. It's possibly the most excited you can get when you see the volunteers just appear and commence the backbreaking tasks such as taking down the marquees, returning heavy fridges to store, packing up stock and returning it to the store room, breaking down tables, tidying up and generally working magic.





Those who might be tempted to criticism of 'todays youth' might be surprised by the general politeness of the children of our village. Beyond this are the 136 Chipping Norton Air Force Cadets who were amazing in the way they worked so willingly to help the event run smoothly. So many individuals to thank but the main message is how blessed we are as a community to have people that freely inconvenience themselves to make our events work so well.

The success of the event was on so many levels. It's not a ticket event so we aren't clear on exact numbers that attend. However we ran out of our stock of over 500 portions on the BBQ and we raised over £1,000 from the bucket collection. As these were record events we have to judge that we had record attendance. While our costs were increased substantially this year we managed to



maintain our previous prices across most of the stalls but still managed to add £700 to our reserves. This is important as our reserves enable us to buy community assets such as the Marquees and to fund stock and prepayments so that we can arrange these events. Along with the fireworks, bar, BBQ and stalls we had entertainment provided by the brilliant Paige and The Red Shift. As always, their music was just right helping maintain the atmosphere of a wonderful evening enjoyed by so many.

### **Christmas Tree Festival**

Pop down to this years Great Rissington Christmas Tree Festival at St John the Baptist Church, on Saturday 10th December 10am-6pm and Sunday 11th December 12noon-6pm. This year's theme is "Anniversaries", so I wonder what the different groups have come up with, including the one created for the UR Social Committee by Jill Harrison, ably assisted by our Treasurer David Harrison. I won't reveal their theme but as always, Jill's creativity and eye for detail is bound to impress.

### **Parish Council Update**



### "Be Like Dan"

More on Dan later ... but first some breaking news from the Parish Council. We're pleased to announce that we have signed a licence with Vistry to allow us to use the Allotments and Tennis Courts ahead of the formal handover of the Public Open Space. As part of our social responsibility, we had an objective to get allotments in use as soon as possible so that it might help with the ongoing cost of living crisis and help alleviate some of the financial strains by hopefully growing our own fruit and vegetables. This is a significant milestone in the overall process and brings forward the ability to use these facilities that would have otherwise had to wait until handover.

We've also recently relaunched the Parish Council Website, with a much fresher and hopefully easier to navigate look and feel. You'll find the regular updates from the council meeting minutes (and agendas) plus the how to book the Village Hall for all your events and activities. There's also a new facility to sign up for notifications when new articles are posted. Please do have a look – all feedback genuinely appreciated.

We recently applied for, and were granted, part-funding for a second defibrillator in the village, and the purchase/fitting is being organised as we speak. We have agreement from Dragon Vets to locate it on the side of their building so that coverage across the village is greatly improved; this also offers some resilience should either machine be put into use (whilst waiting for it to be reset).

In my last article for the Breeze I mentioned the Bowling Green being a good indicator of how close we are to POS handover and most of you will have seen it's pretty much complete (bar a fence around it). We are now working with Vistry to come up with the formal handover plan and I hope I will have much broader details in the next couple of months.

Of course, in order to get over the final few hurdles, and release the village from the grasp of the developers (who have been here far too long), there's still a fair bit of work to be done, and this leads me on to an appeal for your help. We still have three vacant seats on the URPC and we are always looking for people to come and help the cause and give up a little bit of their time to make a difference. I occasionally hear that people are unsure about what is involved so I asked one of our newer councillors for a few words on why they joined the Parish Council about this time last year. Here's what Cllr Dan Holden says:

"In 2021, I applied to be a Councillor having seen the positive difference that a sense of community can make. I spent a lot of time, even before the pandemic, working from home which allows me to walk everyday around our wonderful village.

Wanting to do more to support the future developments of Upper Rissington, I wanted to share my skills as a Chartered Public Relations professional to help residents feel better informed about the activities of the Council.

I had no idea originally what being a Parish Councillor involves but having joined a couple of meetings, just as an observer (which everyone in the village is welcome to do), it wasn't as daunting as I thought.

I'd encourage anyone to come along and speak to us to find out more about what we do. The time commitment isn't as bad as you might be thinking. Do stop me anytime if you spot me out walking as I'll be happy to chat."

If you are thinking of joining us please do get in touch with Dan, me, any of the councillors or Vanessa the Parish Clerk, and we would be more than happy to explain more. It is an extremely valuable and rewarding role in the community and with many emerging projects coming up over the next few years it will be a really interesting time for the village. We need your help to make Upper Rissington the best it possibly can be.

So, all that's left is for me, on behalf of everyone at the Parish Council, to wish you, your friends and families a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year. Here's to 2023!

# CHRISTMAS IS ROUND THE CORNER

Rotary in the Rissingtons (RitR) has been so busy since the last issue of the Breeze I need more than our regular space to tell you about it.

Firstly, the death of Her Majesty the Queen forced us to postpone the Pizza and Quiz Night, but more of that later. The Treasure Hunt "revisited" held in October was a great success, finishing up at the Cotswold Barn for prizegiving. We have delivered the Tools for Africa to Crickhowell where they begin their journey to Mwanza in Tanzania. Most prized were the six sewing machines. Each of these will form the nucleus of a new business to support local families. Purple 4 Polio, the

international Rotary campaign to eradicate polio, resulted in presentations being given to 550 children at the Rissington and Bourton Primary Schools. They listened intently to what was being said, taking particular interest in the simple precaution of hand-washing after going to the toilet!! Funds were raised to vaccinate 1500 children in Pakistan and Afghanistan against polio. RitR was also visible at the local fireworks and at the November Cheltenham Race Meeting where we supported Riding for the Disabled.



Looking ahead, we launch the Community Award scheme before Christmas with the presentation taking place in January. Get your thinking caps on ... check out the blue posters with more information and get voting. Look out for our very own Drive-By Santa on Christmas Eve!! The rescheduled Pizza and Quiz Night will be held in the Village Hall on Saturday 21 January. # DRIVERS URGENTLY NEEDED IN BOURTON AREA AS SERVICE DEMAND INCREASES

Local charity Cotswold Friends is putting out a plea for drivers in the Bourton-on-the-Water area and surrounding villages, as the demand on its Community Transport Service continues to increase. Over 1,600 people living in the Cotswolds use Cotswold Friends' Community Transport Service, with more than 12,000 journeys undertaken by the charity's volunteer drivers last year for medical, social and practical reasons – that's over 230 drives on average every week of the year.

Jo Hammond, CEO of Cotswold Friends said, "With many hospitals catching up with appointments after the pandemic, plus the roll-out of this season's COVID and flu vaccinations, many of our older, vulnerable clients are needing transport to medical appointments right now. This is putting pressure on our existing volunteer drivers and our Community Transport service as a whole, which is vital to so many older and vulnerable people who do not have access to public transport or find it difficult to use.

"Volunteering is enjoyable and rewarding, and there is so much to be gained from it. Our drivers tell us that they feel more connected to their community and enjoy meeting new people, often making friends for life. Drivers are paid up to 50p per mile which significantly helps with the running costs of their vehicle. You'll be at the heart of delivering our mission to reduce isolation and support older and vulnerable people to live independently."

Carolyn Roberts is a Cotswold Friends volunteer driver in the village of Hazleton. She says:"I was interested in becoming a volunteer because my mother lived alone in a tiny hamlet with no public transport, and when she stopped driving, she was very isolated.

"What I enjoy about volunteering for the charity is the chance to meet other people in the locality and discovering local communities that are new to me. The role is flexible, which is good for me, as I enjoy helping people, but I can't commit to being part of a team."

A driving role at Cotswold Friends provides complete volunteering flexibility. Drivers can let the charity's Booking Office know when they want to drive and what types of journey they are happy to do; some drivers like local drives, others prefer longer journeys.




